

PONDER THIS!

Abortion provider to colleagues: *Don't let women see the sonogram!* Do you wonder why?

According to Dr. Sally Faith Dorfman, who worked at Einstein Medical College: "A compassionate and sensitive sonographer should remember to turn the screen away from the plane of view [of the woman having an abortion]. Staff, too, may find themselves increasingly disturbed by the repeated visual impact of an aspect of their work that they need to partially deny in order to continue to function optimally and to concentrate on the needs of the women who come to them for help."

Yes, by their own admission, the repeated viewing of an active unborn child can have an impact on both the mother [potential abortion candidate], the sonographers, and other health care workers.

Why is the sight of an unborn baby on a sonogram so disturbing? Could it be that the reality of the humanity of the unborn becomes apparent and undeniable. Maybe in the mind of person who has been taught at some point the Ten Commandments the recall of "Thou shalt not kill," is remembered and begins to fill their mind.

"She came back!" could be heard around the office. This young woman had been so hard to reach when first she came for her *Earn While You Learn* classes.

She had come to this country from Africa with no support system in the US. The baby's father remained in their home country with the hopes that she would give birth to his child and return. That so far has not happened. She became so attached to her client mentor that return was not possible. Besides, she had a new baby, was hired to work in a job that allowed her to care for her child at the office and the infant items and information she was getting helped ease her fears for the future.

With her busy schedule we were not sure she could find the time to return for any Life Skill lessons. To our amazement her employer insisted she come back!

Her employer could see the change in her attitude from when he first hired her and the value of the new concepts she was learning. He wanted her to encourage others she knew in a similar situation who worked at the same place to take advantage of the practical assistance and parenting concepts she was learning. We were thrilled to have her back!
